Week 1	Read Chapters 1 – 3 in the book, and Lesson 1 in the Work Book
Week 2	Read Chapters 4 -6 in the book, and Lesson 2 in the Work Book
Week 3	Read Chapters 7-9 in the book, and Lesson 3 in the Work Book

Week 8	Read Chapters 26-29 in the book, and Lesson 9 in the Work Book



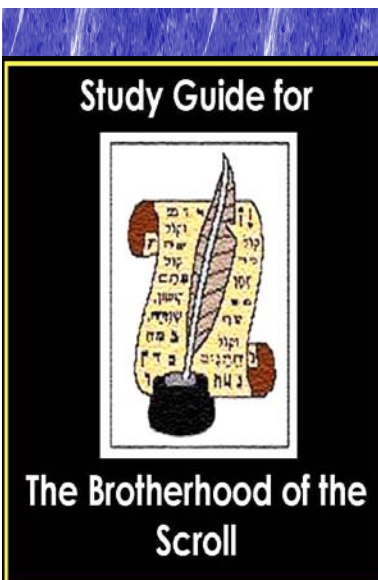
What Do People Think About Using The Brotherhood of the Scroll for Small Group Bible Study?



After watching a 6 minute video about **The Brotherhood of the Scroll**, Respondents were asked to choose one of the following 6 responses in answer to these 4 statements:

Strongly Disagree =1, Disagree =2, Somewhat Disagree =3, Somewhat Agree = 4, Agree = 5, Strongly Agree = 6.

While only 84.8% agreed at some level with the statement that they liked "to read historical fiction," 91% agreed at some level with questions 2 and 3, while 86.7% said they believed "my pastor would be interested in learning how this novel could be used for small group bible study."



33 people responded to a survey on Surveymonkey.com which posed these four statements:

- Q1. I like to read historical fiction
- Q2. A novel set during the time of Judah's exile to Babylon would interest me.
- Q3. The idea of using a novel and accompanying study guide for a bible study interests me.
- Q4. I believe my pastor would be interested in learning how this novel could be used for small group bible study.
